## Job fair ends

Over 50 thousand job seekers, of those 40 thousand applied through on line and the rest directly, applied for jobs during the two-day long job fair that ended yesterday in the city.

The different national and multinational companies selected 300 eligible candidates from among the applicants.

The fair, organised by Jubo Karmasangsthan Society (Jubok), received huge response, as thousands of job seekers crowded the fair and collected application forms from the information booths to get jobs offered by 30 companies.

State Minister for Finance and Planning affairs Shah Muhammad Abul Hossain handed over appointment letters to the successful candidates as chief guest at a function organised at Osmani Memorial Hall that was presided over by Vice chancellor of Eastern University Professor AK Fazlul Haq Shah.

He said, the process of holding such job fair should continue, as it would help reduce unemployment and enhance a fair recruitment process.

Some business houses and NGOs offered different jobs in the fields of accounting, finance, education, engineering, information technology, law, management, marketing, media and medical science.

An executive of a company said 'our main objective is to create job opportunities and to reduce difference between employers and jobseekers.
